

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

When do I need a building permit?

Building permits are required for all new construction, additions/alterations and interior and exterior renovations, including sheds, outbuildings and other structures, see Meredith Zoning Ordinance, *Article VI*. Certain items are not considered structures and do not need building permits: water wells, gates, lampposts, mailboxes, flagpoles, children's play sets, well coverings, walkways and uncovered patios.

Do I need a building permit to replace my windows or repaint my house?

Normal maintenance and repair, e.g. painting, wallpapering, floor-sanding, and in-kind replacement of windows, doors, roofs or siding does not require a building permit.

Do I need a building permit to install solar panels or to replace a shingled roof with a standing-seam roof?

Upgrades or alterations to energy systems, roofs, siding, etc. does require a building permit.

How do I know if my property is enrolled in the Current Use program?

Current Use status is reported on your property tax card — for a copy, please contact the Assessing Department at Town Office or visit our Assessing page on the Town website.

What is the snow load requirement for roofs?

Roofs must be designed for an 80-1b snow load.

What is the maximum building height?

Building heights vary depending on zoning districts. Please review *Article V* of the Zoning Ordinance for reference.

How long do I have to finish my building project?

The building permit expires in one year, the project must have at least 25% completed prior to a permit being renewed or extended after the one-year period.

When can I move in?

You must receive a Certificate of Occupancy from the Code Enforcement Officer prior to moving in.
