Talking Points

- Ken: What can we as a committee do to help the town make the right decisions?
- Phil: Understand the budget environment and the process. There is no room in the budget this year for major capital expenditures, BUT. There are a number of things that can and are being done to reduce energy consumption in the municipal buildings with the costs coming out of the department operating budgets.
- Examples: New power management software for the Community Center. Motion detectors for appropriate locations. Changing to Variable Flow Pumps at the Water Department will have a significant impact on electric usage. Address the low-hanging fruit from an insulation and air infiltration standpoint where feasible in the older buildings.

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• Phil: For larger projects the proper process would be to prepare for next spring's Capital Investment Projects Committee meeting. There are a number of ways energy conservation projects could be bundled together and presented to the CIP Committee. They could be building based or they could be theme based. The proposals must be budget based, demonstrating the economic benefits.

Additional Business

Ken raised for discussion the question as to whether we should be thinking about another Energy Fair.
