Having a quorum, Bruce opened the WWAC meeting at 8:03 am.

### Winnipesauke Watershed Management plan:

- John Edgar presented a brief update on the work Meredith is doing with Laconia to develop a Winnipesauke Watershed Management plan.
- Focus is on reducing/managing the phosphorus level in the lake.
- Representing Meredith, John Edgar has identified several sources of concern:
  - Catch basins
  - Monkey Pond
  - Hawkins Brook

to name a few. John requested input from the WWAC for any issues which he would in turn bring to the Winnipesauke Watershed team.

The 2/17/10 WWAC meeting minutes were approved as had been updated.

#### Spear Property/Waukewan Shore Owners Association update:

- Re: the application for a grant, Duncan reported that the WSOA concluded that preparing the grant request was such an arduous task that they elected to drop its pursuit.
- Duncan reported that a letter was hand delivered on Monday 3/15/10 to Mr. Stowell's office outlining the conditions on which the WSOA would pursue the Spear property purchase. The letter requested Mr. Stowell's response by Friday 3/19/10.
- Bruce reported that the Center Harbor Conservation Commission is pursuing that the Snake River be declared a Prime Wetlands area.

### **Lawn Care Sub-committee report:**

- Randy reported that 1000 copies each of 3 fliers were printed. Flier #1 has a No Phosphorus statement on one side and a No Pesticide statement on the other side. Likewise, Flier #2 has the same, but uses different facts to rationalize the No Phosphorus/No Pesticide statements. Flier #3 points out the NH regulation of no Pesticide application within 250' of the water's edge in the Waukewan Watershed.
- Randy expects the next Lawn Care Subcommittee meeting on March 31 @ 8:00 am to be its last meeting.

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- Angela reported that the Lawn Care Subcommittee report is on the Meredith Selectmen's
  Workshop agenda for May 4<sup>th</sup>. Since people start applying lawn treatments in March & April, the
  Lawn Care Subcommittee will proceed immediately to getting the No Phosphorus/No Pesticide
  word out. It had been hoped that the Selectmen would be briefed on these activities before the
  Subcommittee went public.
- It was suggested that Randy attend the next Meredith Selectmen's Meeting, in order to make the Selectmen aware of the Lawn Care plans, during the Meeting's "Other Business" timeslot.

### Lake Waukewan Dissolved Oxygen issue:

• Bruce reported on an activity that is evaluating the effectiveness of wind driven aerators on a small pond in NH. This could potentially be a solution to improving the dissolved oxygen level in the Waukewan Watershed.

#### **Septic System Health Ordinance status:**

- Bruce reported that the committee creating this ordinance is still waiting for David Ames' input. This is believed to be the last element to complete the ordinance.
- It was suggested that this Health Ordinance be included with the Lawn Care report at the 5/4/10 Selectmen's workshop.

### **Impervious Surfaces:**

• Stan Wallerstein suggested that perhaps the topic of impervious surfaces and its effect on run-off should our next focus point.
