WAUKEWAN PESTICIDE FREE ZONE

Did You Know?

- Lake Waukewan is the sole public drinking supply for the Town of Meredith
 - Pesticides applied to lawns and gardens contaminate local streams, ponds and lakes
 - Runoff from cosmetic lawn pesticides contaminates local watersheds and stresses municipal water treatment
 - Toxic Pesticides cannot be filtered or treated from public drinking water and private wells
 - Children exposed to herbicides during the first five years of life are 4 1/2 times more likely to be diagnosed with asthma before the age of five.
- **And Did You Know That:**
 - NH Rule 502.04(a) protects public water supplies by requiring a special permit to apply pesticides anywhere within 250 feet of the Waukewan Watershed surface waters (see red zone on back map).
 - This law applies to both professional applicators as well as landowners!

Avoid toxic chemicals and seek out natural lawn care solutions!

Maintain a Healthy Family Environment . . .

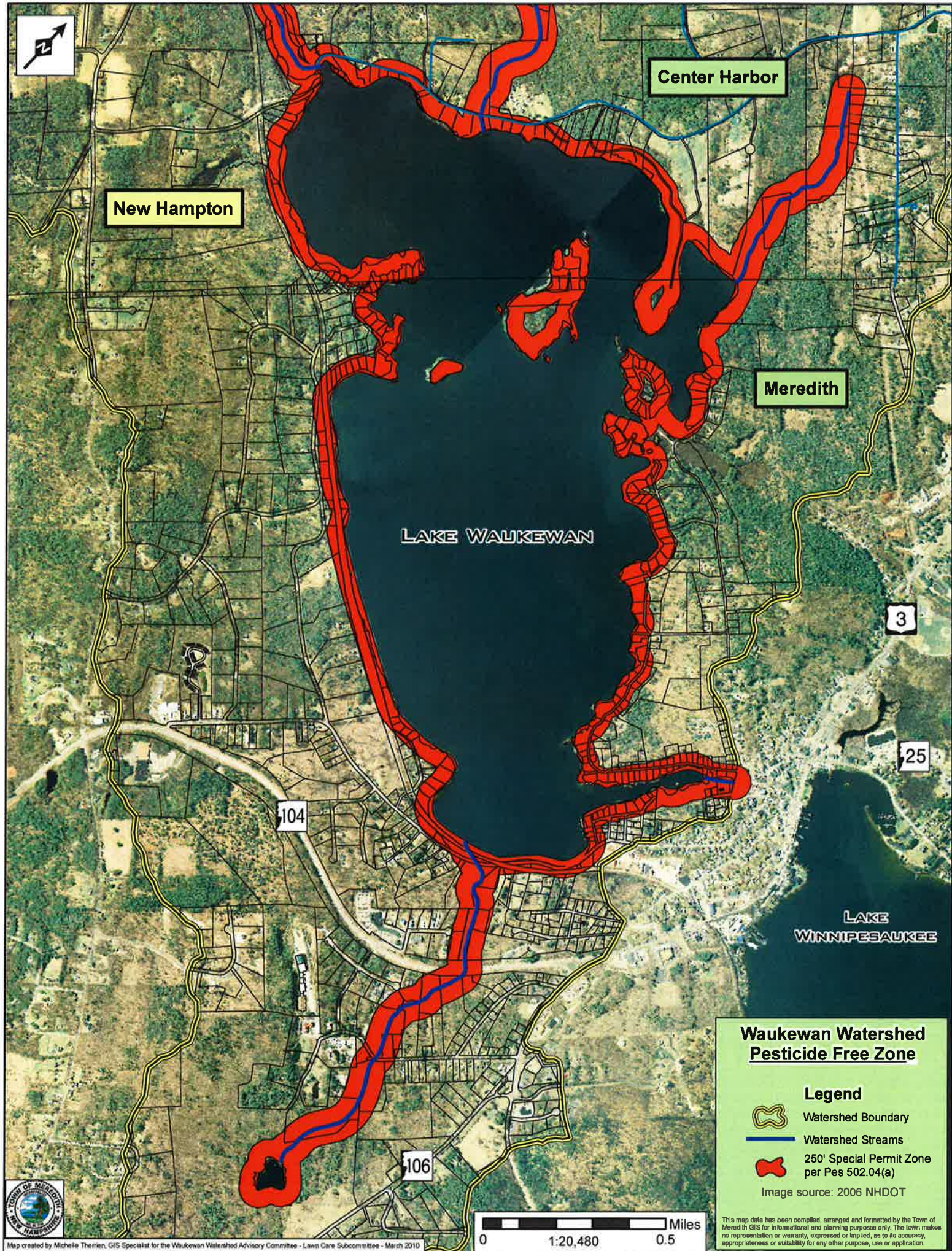
Keep your lawn and lake off drugs . . .
